No more than two for funding eligible partners from Austria participating in the call will be accepted within one consortium! Please note that Austrian participants cannot participate in a consortium under the widening option at the full proposal stage.

Researchers are eligible to apply if their publication record over the last five years has been internationally visible and if their current career stage is commensurate with the career progression expected in their field. (see [1.4.1 General requirements](#))

The current FWF salary scale ([Personnel costs \(fwf.ac.at\)](#)) indicates the salaries that may be requested. For scientists funded by the FWF, the funding is limited to “project-specific costs”, i.e. personnel and non-personnel costs that are essential to carry out the project and that go beyond the resources made available from the research institution’s infrastructure, according to the general FWF Funding Guidelines published at [Application guidelines Principal Investigator Project \(PROFI mode\) \(fwf.ac.at\)](#)

The FWF does not finance infrastructure or basic equipment at research institutions. Overheads may not be requested. Subcontracts must be well justified, i.e. must represent the only or the most economical way to have the work performed, please contact the FWF directly for clarification of individual cases.

FWF Submission:

In addition to the application to the call secretariat, **pre-proposals** must be submitted online to the FWF at <https://elane.fwf.ac.at> via the programme category “PIK – International Projects” (preproposal)”. The deadline for submission is 16th of January 2025, 2 pm CET (local time in Vienna)

For the full-proposal stage, applicants must choose the programme category “KIN – International – Multilateral Initiatives” The deadline for full-proposal submission is 10th of July 2025, 2 pm CEST (local time in Vienna)

Both steps are mandatory.

All proposals must be submitted using the elane online portal. Project funding is administered through the research institution (PROFI); for this reason, the submission must be approved in the application portal both by the applicant and by the respective research institution.

Please note that the number of ongoing/approved projects in which one researcher can serve as principal investigator is limited to three in the Stand-Alone Projects Programme, International Programmes, Clinical Research and Arts-Based Research Programmes. !! IMPORTANT !!

- Applicants for FWO funding must submit a **mandatory administrative application via the [FWO E-loket](#)**.
 - For fundamental research projects (FO) select the application type: ‘Research projects – European programme fundamental research’.
 - For strategic basis research projects (SBO) select the application type: ‘Research projects – European programme strategic basic research’.

In case the consortium includes more than one partner requesting funding from FWO, a single online form should be submitted by the main PI (promotor(-spokesperson)) itself, through its personal ‘e-loket’, containing all relevant information for the different Flemish partners.

The deadline to submit this administrative application to the FWO is identical to the deadline of the joint transnational call (pre-proposal stage). To ensure the eligibility of the proposal, it is recommended to

consult the FWO administration at least one week in advance. Failure to comply with these requirements can lead to ineligibility.

- o Participation in this call does not interfere with the ‘regular/national’ project submission framework, and is consequently not taken into account for calculating the max. available number of new applications and running projects combined. **However, researchers can only participate within 2 different international consortia in this call as partner.**
- o Projects aiming at the development of a spin-off company are not eligible in this context.
- o The project duration is limited to 36 months, which implies the funding has to be budgeted and spent accordingly. An automatic prolongation and using positive (financial) balances after the end date is not applicable in this framework. As such article 28 of the [FWO Research Projects](#) and article 14 of the [Strategic Basic Research \(SBO\)](#) regulations do not apply here.
- o The PI, for each of the participating institutions applying for FWO funds, must hold an **appointment that fully covers the duration of the research project.**

Linked to the above, when it comes to the [FWO research project regulations \(FO\)](#): article 10, §7 is not applicable in this call. I.e. supervisors (-spokespersons), or coordinators/consortium partners in this context, who are granted **emeritus status** during the calendar year of submission of the project application or during the duration of the project execution, are **not eligible**.

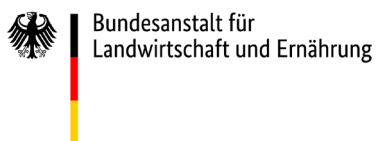

Eligible organisations

Universities, research institutes, companies, private and public organisations that engage in economic activity, public authorities, and NGOs are eligible to receive funding from Swedish Funders for this call. The grants paid out by Swedish Funders must be administrated by a Swedish organisation, i.e. they need to be a Swedish legal entity with a Swedish organisation registration number.

Formas' and Vinnova's standard eligibility criteria apply.

First payment from Swedish Funders will be administrated from the earliest January 2026 (project start may still be end of 2025).

State aid rules

The rules on state aid apply to organisations that carry out economic activities. Economic activity is generally defined as any activity consisting in offering goods or services on a given market. If an organisation falls in the economic activity category, then state aid rules apply¹.

In this call for proposals, when we grant funding to these organisations, we do so with the support of EU Commission Block Exemption Regulation (GBER):

- Fundamental Research (9 § / art. 25)
- Industrial research (9 § / art. 25).
- Experimental development (9 § / art. 25).
- Aid for process and organisational innovation (13 § / art. 29).

¹ Applicants who would be receivers of state aid, in case funding is approved by Swedish Funders, need to be aware that the legal requirements for transparent reporting of state aid have been changed in 2023. This means that approved state aid which amounts to 100 000 euro or more to one Project Party (or if the project concerns primary agriculture sector or fishery and aquaculture sector 10 000 euro), must be reported openly within the EU. Swedish Funders is responsible for this reporting. Those who submit an application are considered to be informed about this requirement of reporting and are considered to approve that this reporting will be made above the legal thresholds.

Universities, research institutes and non-profit legal entities as well as public bodies may receive funding of up to 100 % of their eligible costs, provided that the project is part of their non-economic activities.

Eligible Costs

Our funding may only go to certain types of costs. These are called eligible costs. In this call for proposals these types of costs are eligible:

- Personnel costs: Salaries, social security contributions and other personnel costs
- Equipment, land and buildings: Instruments, equipment and rent for premises other than regular business premises
- Consulting and licensing costs: Consulting services, knowledge and patents purchased or used under license from an external actor. Consultancy costs should not exceed 10-20% of a project part's budget
- Other direct costs: For example materials, stock items and travel necessary to carry out the project
- Indirect costs (overhead, OH): Costs that are not incurred as an immediate consequence of but can be related to the project, for example regular premises and cleaning. Universities and colleges may budget for indirect costs according to their usual full cost principle. For other organisations, indirect costs may constitute a maximum of 30 percent of personnel costs, unless special rules apply, as is the case for instance for state-funded research institutes or organisations. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that the correct level for indirect costs is applied in the application.

For more detailed information on which costs we can finance, see the instruction on eligible costs below.

For a cost to be eligible, it must be necessary for the activities of the project. Project costs must also be properly accounted for and reported separately from the organisation's other costs. An organisation may also not take up someone else's costs as its own. Terms and conditions

Applicants (individuals) need to follow the rules and regulations of the transnational call and of the national requirements.

Eligible applicants are from Dutch universities, universities of applied sciences, research institutions and public bodies domiciled in The Netherlands.

Eligible non-profit organizations, SME's and others must be registered and well established in the Netherlands. These organizations may apply and are advised to contact the National Contact Person of the Ministry to approve eligibility and to get further terms and conditions.

An application for funding from the Ministry has a single main applicant. This main applicant is from a research institute and responsible for the project- and financial management of all co-applicants/project members for whom funding is requested. Co-applicants within an application for the Ministry funding are then allowed.

An applicant may only request funding of the Ministry for one project (part of a European Consortium) in this Call of proposals.

The subsidy is coming from the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries, Food Security and Nature (LVVN). The following conditions apply:

1) For Wageningen Research (WR) and other TO2 institutes (research institutes for applied science):

The 'TO2-regulation' (<https://wetten.overheid.nl/BWBR0040605/2018-07-25>) and the tariff agreement under it apply.

2) For other research and knowledge dissemination organizations and universities:

De Kaderwet EZK- en LNV subsidies (<https://wetten.overheid.nl/BWBR0007919/2019-01-01/> - article 2a) applies.

Eligible costs are personnel costs for the performance of the project and direct costs such as materials, small scientific equipment, travelling expenses and other costs that can be justified as necessary to carry out the proposed activities. Project management can be maximum of 10% of the total project costs. Travel expenses can be maximum of 5% of the total project costs.

All co-applicants that are to receive the grant from the Ministry through the main applicant, are subject to the de-minimis regulation (Regulation (EU) no. 1407/2013 of the European Commission of 18 December 2013), except for research organizations. Based on the de-minimis regulation, co-applicants may receive a maximum of 300.000 € in government support over a period of three years. By completing the de-minimis statement, consortium partners declare that in the event of the award of a grant by the ministry, they will not exceed the de-minimis threshold. If a consortium partner finds that the de-minimis threshold will be exceeded with the

grant from SIA (and other possible de-minimis aid), this consortium partner cannot receive funding from the ministry through the main applicant. The main applicant must take this into account when drawing up the application budget, and must therefore check for each consortium partner that will be involved as a co-applicant whether the subsidy amount applied for does not exceed the de-minimis threshold. The de-minimis statement, completed separately by each consortium partner, forms part of the full proposal.”

- the Max Planck Institute for Psycholinguistics in Nijmegen;
- Naturalis Biodiversity Center;
- Advanced Research Centre for NanoLithography (ARCNL);
- Princess Máxima Center.

Persons with a zero-hour employment agreement or with a contract for a limited period of time (other than a tenure track appointment) may not submit a proposal.

It could be the case that a tenure track agreement ends before the intended completion date of the project for which funding is applied for, or that before that date, the applicant's tenured contract ends due to a researcher the applicant reaching retirement age. In that case, the researcher applicant needs to include a statement from their employer in which the organisation concerned guarantees that the project and all project members for whom funding has been requested will receive adequate supervision for the full duration of the project. Such a statement should be submitted in the full proposal stage.

Applicants with a part-time contract should guarantee adequate supervision of the project and all project members for whom funding is requested.

Furthermore, researchers may be interested to apply as a co-applicant within an application for NWO funding. Co-applicants within an application for NWO funding may be affiliated to the research organisations listed above, to universities of applied sciences, and to other research organisations as referred to in Article 1.1, paragraph 4 of the NWO Grant Rules which meet the following cumulative conditions.

The organisation must:

- be established in the Netherlands;

- be a foundation, association or legal entity governed by public law;
- have as its primary goal the independent conduct of its own fundamental research, industrial research or experimental development;
- be able to state that the organisation keeps separate accounts with regard to economic/non-economic activities and that undertakings with decisive influence on the organisation do not enjoy preferential access to the organisation's results.

NWO will not fund research organisations under this Call for proposals that are primarily engaged in the wide dissemination of the results of research activities by way of teaching, publication or knowledge.

Please note: Prior to the submission of an application NWO assesses on the basis of the above-mentioned conditions whether an organisation complies with Article 1.1, paragraph 4 of the NWO Grant Rules and may therefore participate as a co-applicant. NWO performs this assessment to preclude the granting of prohibited state aid. This assessment must also be conducted if an organisation was assessed within another NWO programme. A research organisation that was approved as an applicant prior to the submission of a pre-proposal or full proposal does not need to be reassessed prior to the submission of the proposal.

The organisation of the prospective co-applicant must provide the following documents prior to the submission deadline for pre-proposals and no later than 6 January 2025 before 13:00:00 CET by email to futurefoods@nwo.nl:

- a recent extract from the Netherlands Chamber of Commerce;
- the deed of incorporation or current articles of association;
- the latest available annual accounts accompanied by an audit statement ;
- the completed Declaration Research organisation, available on the funding page of this Call for proposals on the NWO website.

Other relevant documentation may be added. NWO may request additional information if the above documents are not sufficiently conclusive to determine whether the organisation may act as a co-applicant.

If the organisation of the prospective co-applicant does not submit the necessary documents for this assessment in time, NWO cannot accept the organisation as a co-applicant. If new co-applicants are added to the consortium in the full proposal and these new co-applicants are not affiliated to an institution listed above, these conditions will also be checked for this organisation/these organisations. The documents listed above must then be submitted by email no later than 26 June 2025 13:00:00 CEST.

Additional eligibility criteria

An application for NWO funding has a single applicant, responsible for scientific and financial management. Co-applicants within an application for NWO funding are allowed (see 'Who may apply').

- A researcher may only request NWO funding for one project (part of a European consortium) in this Call for proposals, either as applicant or co-applicant within an application for NWO funding.
- Researchers may not apply for a scientific or post-doc position for themselves.

Eligible costs

Available budget modules are as follows.

- *Personnel*

- Personnel at a university in the Kingdom of the Netherlands, umc or a research organisation, as referred to in Article 1.1, first paragraph, subparagraphs c to h of the NWO Grant Rules:
 - Postdoc: at least 1 position, for at least 12 months, for at least 0.5 fte, according to UNL or NFU rates, a benchfee is applicable
 - Non-scientific personnel (NWP): according to UNL or NFU rates
 - Research leave: max. 5% of the grant amount, according to UNL or NFU rates
- Personnel of universities of applied sciences and other research organisations as referred to in Article 1.1, paragraph 4 of the NWO Grant Rules: according to HOT rates
- Students: according to the usual internship fee or HOT rates, may be added to material costs

- *Material*: for project-specific material costs, up to 25% of the grant amount allocated for personnel costs

- *Knowledge utilisation*: for activities that promote the use of knowledge from the research following the Impact Plan approach, obligatory 5-20% of the grant amount

- *Projectmanagement*: up to 5% of the grant amount

Please note the following:

- PhD positions cannot be applied for in this call, due to the maximum project duration of 3 years.
- NWO funds project-related costs. Therefore overhead costs are not eligible for NWO funding.

A more detailed explanation of the budget modules and eligible costs can be found on the funding page on the NWO website.

It is **recommended** to use the NWO budget template (obligatory in full proposal phase) in the pre-proposal stage to confirm eligibility of budget items. For Full Proposals, it is **mandatory** to submit the NWO budget form for the funding requested at NWO at the time of the transnational deadline. Please submit it to futurefoods@nwo.nl.

Further information

Once proposals are selected for funding, the consortia will be notified by the FutureFoodS Call Office and subsequently, the national granting process will be initiated by NWO.

The NWO Grant Rules and the Approval of funding for scientific research 2008 are applicable to the part of the project's budget covered by the grant from NWO. Any arrangements made regarding the part of the project's budget covered by the grant from NWO, for instance in a Consortium Agreement, must comply with the NWO Grant Rules 2024 and the European legislation on state aid.

As stipulated in the NWO Grant Rules, Article 3.2, paragraph 2, the project cannot start until the conditions set out in the grant award decision regarding the start of the project are met. Please note, these conditions will include a signed Consortium agreement by all partners in the transnational project.

Under the Dutch General Administrative Law Act, any interested party has the right to lodge an objection to the decision taken by NWO within six weeks of the date of the decision letter. Further information about the objections procedure can be found on the NWO website:

NWO will, if necessary, apply a one-off indexation of personnel costs when awarding the grant. The UNL/NFU/HOT rate at the time of the decision date applies and the date on which the rates take effect is used for this purpose.

Submission of financial and scientific reports at national level is required in accordance with the rules of NWO. Granted consortia will be informed in due time.

Please note: an application for NWO funding can be combined with, but cannot be the same as an application for funding to either Taskforce for Applied Research SIA or LVVN for this Call for proposals. In case of questions, please contact the relevant contact persons well ahead of the submission deadline.

<p>Eligibility of a partner as a beneficiary institution</p> <p>Only Universities of applied sciences (UAS) as referred to in Article 1.8 of the Dutch Higher Education and Research Act (<i>Wet op het hoger onderwijs en wetenschappelijk onderzoek</i>, WHW) are eligible as <i>main applicant</i>. Main applicants are required to submit a mandatory SIA budget form in the Full Proposal stage, as well as a <i>de-minimis</i> form for each partner receiving funding if applicable. The</p>							

budget form and the de-minimis form will be made available on the callpage of Regieorgaan SIA www.regieorgaan-sia.nl/ffs before the full proposal phase. All other applicants are cooperation partners and can only apply in cooperation with the main applicant.

Please note: researchers based in the Netherlands who are interested to apply for funding in this Call for proposals, are recommended to carefully read the national annexes of the three participating Dutch funding organisations: the Dutch Research Council (NWO), Taskforce for Applied Research SIA, and the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries, Food Security and Nature (LVVN). Please do not hesitate to contact the relevant contact points in case of questions.

Additional eligibility criteria for SIA

The board of the UAS has to be informed about the submission of this proposal and needs to agree with its content.

At the full proposal phase, it is required to attach a SIA financial details form to the application (similar to RAAK-Publiek). This form will be available via www.regieorgaan-sia.nl/ffs.

All cooperation partners that are to receive the grant from SIA through the main applicant, are subject to the *de-minimis* regulation Regulation (EU) no. 2023/2831 of the European Commission of 13 december 2023), except for the research organisations summed up in article 1.1, paragraph 1, of the NWO Grant Rules. Based on the *de-minimis* regulation, cooperation partners may receive a maximum of 300.000 € in government support over a period of three years, except for some sectors which may have other thresholds. By completing the *de-minimis* statement, consortium partners declare that in the event of the award of a grant by SIA, they will not exceed the *de-minimis* threshold. If a consortium partner finds that the *de-minimis* threshold will be exceeded with the grant from SIA (and other possible *de-minimis* aid), this consortium partner cannot receive funding from SIA through the main applicant. The main applicant must take this into account when drawing up the application budget, and must therefore check for each consortium partner that will be involved as a cooperation partner whether the subsidy amount applied for does not exceed the *de-minimis* threshold. The *de-minimis* statement, completed separately by each consortium partner, forms part of the full proposal.

Eligible costs

Funding for Universities of Applied Sciences: no limit on number of positions.

Other partners (than UAS), like SMEs, public authorities and/or NGO's may be funded within the project. Maximum funding percentage for these partners is 50% of their costs.

In total the maximum allowed funding for other consortium partners, excluding the universities of applied sciences, is 25% of the funding by SIA.

Personnel

Funding can be applied for staff of universities of applied sciences (UAS), TO2 institutes, other educational institutions and other organizations, including public organizations and SMEs. Rates are determined using the most recent Handleiding Overheidstarieven (HOT), table 2 'gemiddelde totale loonkosten per salarisschaal', column 'Uurtarief productieve uren, excl. btw'. The salary scale of the requested position determines the rate from the HOT table. This rate applies for the entire duration of the project. For academic universities, the UNL rate at the time of the decision date apply.

For organizations that do not use the collective bargaining agreement (cao) of the central government or a comparable collective bargaining agreement (including those of UAS, secondary vocational education, and lower authorities), the following salary scales from the HOT apply: Project support worker: scale 6. Junior (researcher): salary scale 10. Medior (researcher): salary scale 12. Senior (researcher): scale 13. Director: scale 16.

Other partners (than UAS), like SMEs, public authorities and/or NGO's may be funded within the project as consortium partners. Maximum funding percentage for these partners is 50% of their costs.

Students

Students may work on the project. If the students contribute as part of their curriculum, the rate applies according to the usual internship fee of the UAS. If students contribute as a side job in addition to their studies as student assistants, the rate according to HOT Table 2 scale 1 applies.

Material Costs

Funding can be requested for all costs for the project and its knock-on effects regarding, among other things, consumables, purchase of services, materials, small instruments, access to (inter)national facilities, software and resources that have no economic value after use. Travel and accommodation costs (national and international) for all people working on the project including foreign guest researchers, costs for the organization of (international) workshops and symposia, costs for data management, publications, and costs in the context of *citizen science* also fall under this module.

Travel expenses (national and international) will only be reimbursed on the basis of second class/economy class fares. For publications, the provisions in the [Beleidsregel Open Access](#) apply.

It is not allowed to include costs for:

- organizational infrastructure and overhead, including a fully functioning workplace, housing, office automation, personnel administration, commuting expenses, training, facility management, HR advice and corporate care, documentary information services and home office allowance.
- use and maintenance of in-house developed scientific infrastructure.
- regular educational activities.

In-kind contribution

A minimum in-kind contribution of 10% is required. The in-kind contribution may be delivered by the UAS or its partners. The in-kind contribution may exist of either personnel or material costs.
